After returning from my service during the Gulf War, I suffered from degenerative arthritis in my legs and other physical and emotional attacks that came after being exposed to environmental toxins. In many ways, I felt I wasn't quite the man I used to be. Routine tasks were no longer possible for me without assistance. The hardest part was trying to accept that my active life, servant's heart, and physical abilities I had enjoyed from my rural upbringing and military career was now beyond my reach. The physical impairment I experienced slowly evolved into a depression.

Like many people, I tried to deal with this on my own. As a Christian, I should have known better. After five years of remaining bedridden at the Mayo Clinic receiving the best of care, and learning to lean more on Christ along the way, I emerged with a new sense of purpose: to serve my fellow veterans.

I was awarded an all-terrain chair through a not-for-profit. I was thrilled to have the mobility to get outside and experience the woods again and to go hunting and fishing, but wondered if I could do more. I made the connection with the Ring-Co team to make modifications. Little did I know what God was doing. My idea of modifying something quickly turned to an all new vehicle that includes Ring-Co's patented quick-attach method as well as a strong, rugged chassis designed for work with careful attention to ergonomics, ingress, and egress.
